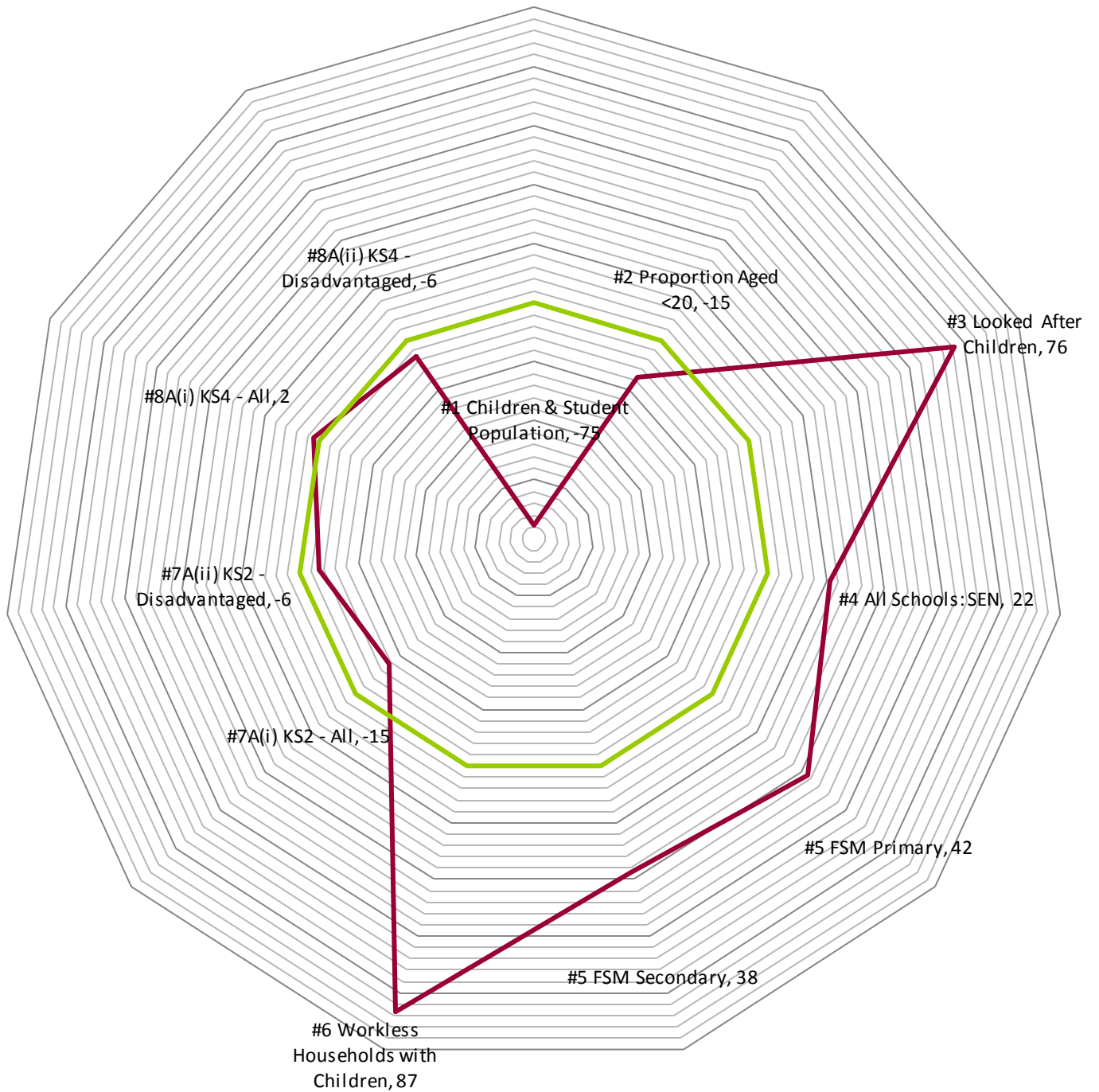

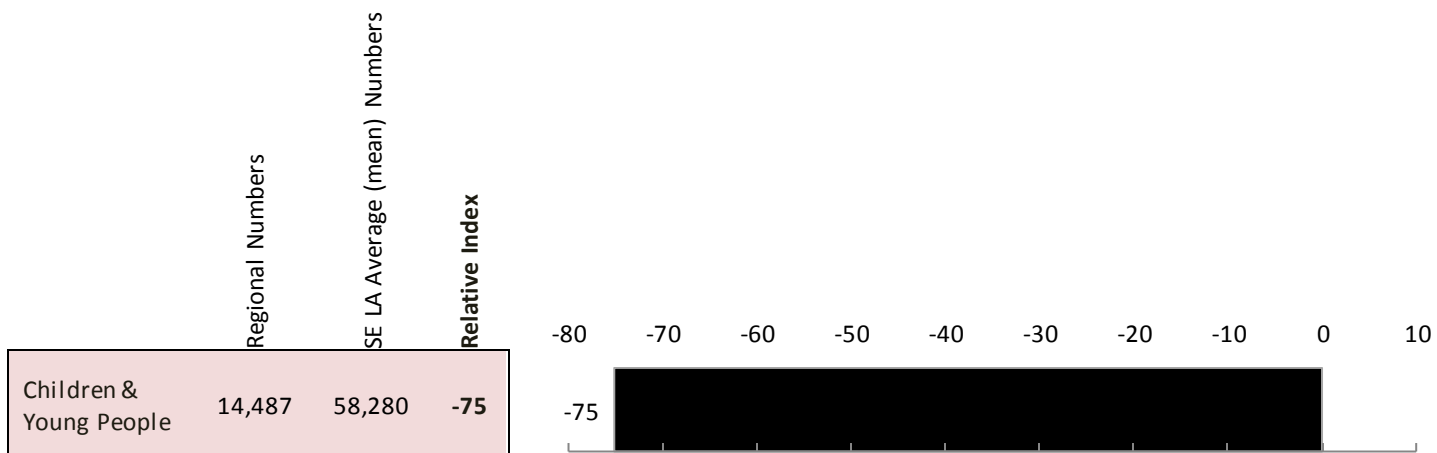
The table below provides a summary of the ten key dimensions and provides an overall contextual score for ISLE OF WIGHT

KEY DIMENSION	RAW INDEX	COMMENTS
1. PUPIL & STUDENT NUMBERS (ACTUAL)	-75	EXTREME – Numbers of CYP population living on the Island are much lower when compared to the SE average figure of 58,280 per Tier 1 LA
2. POPULATION UNDER 20 (%)	-15	NOTEWORTHY – The proportion of Young People is notably lower in the island population by those under 20, compared to the SE as a whole
3. LOOKED AFTER CHILDREN (%)	76	EXTREME – The proportion of Looked after children in the region is extremely higher than the average SE figure
4. SEN CHILDREN (%)	22	SIGNIFICANT – numbers of SEN children is significantly higher in the region when compared to the SE as a whole
5a. FSM: Primary (%)	42	SIGNIFICANT – the percentage of Primary CYPs eligible for Free School Meals is significantly higher in the Region compared to the SE
5b. FSM: Secondary (%)	38	SIGNIFICANT – the percentage of Secondary CYPs eligible for Free School Meals is significantly higher in the Region compared to the SE
6. CYPs in WORKLESS HOUSEHOLDS (%)	87	EXTREME – CYP are EXTREMELY more likely to live in a workless household compared to the SE average
7A(i). KS2 RESULTS - ALL	-15	NOTEWORTHY – Attainment at KS2 is notably lower than the English figure
7A(ii). KS2 RESULTS - DISADVANTAGED	-6	TYPICAL – The attainment gap closes when considering Disadvantaged children
8A(i). KS4 RESULTS	2	TYPICAL – The trend changes at KS4 where results are typical of the state school average scores across England
8A(ii). KS4 RESULTS - DISADVANTAGED	-6	TYPICAL – The trend reverts back once Disadvantaged children are taken into account

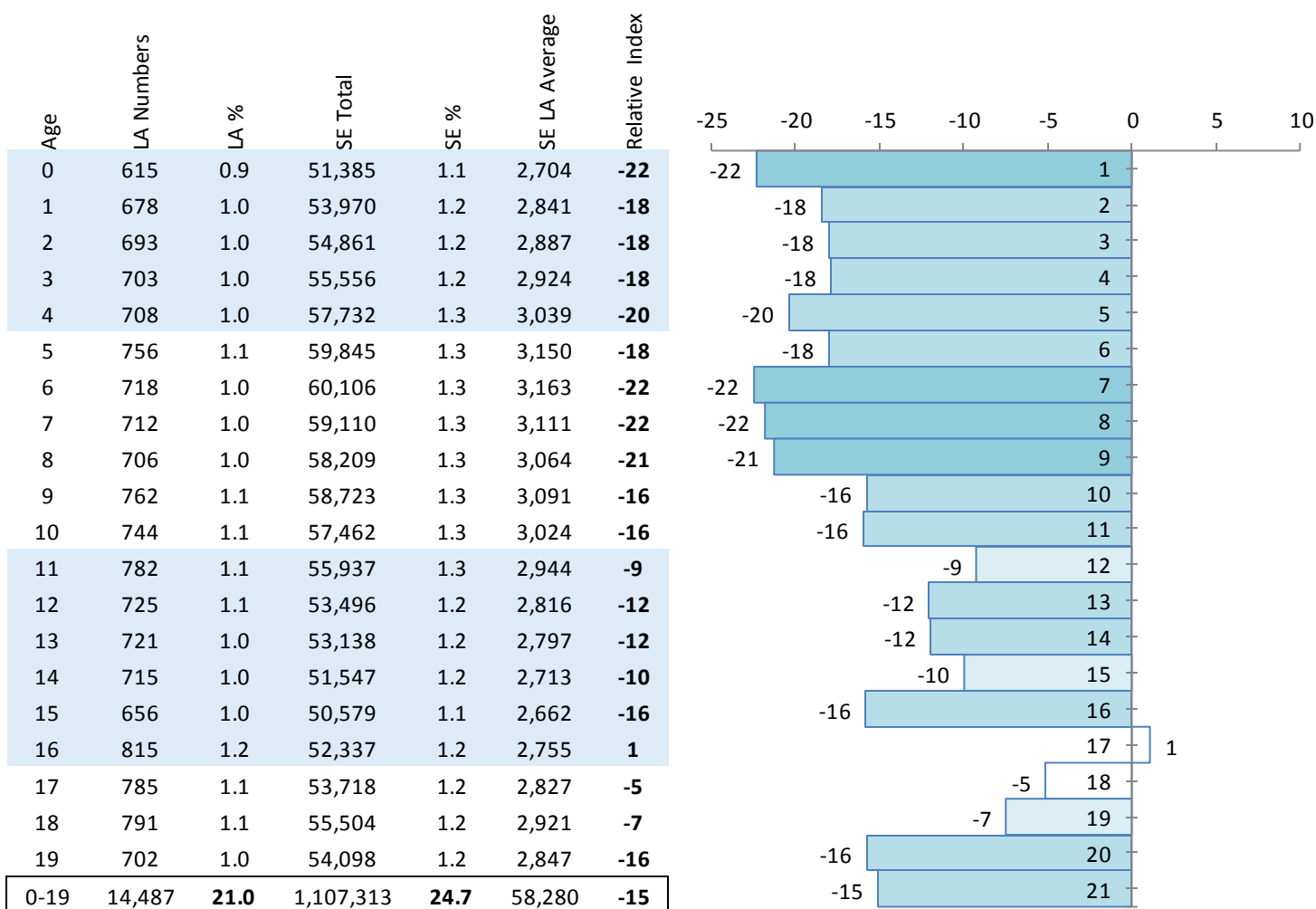

3. INDICATOR #1: CYP POPULATION – PUPIL & STUDENT NUMBERS



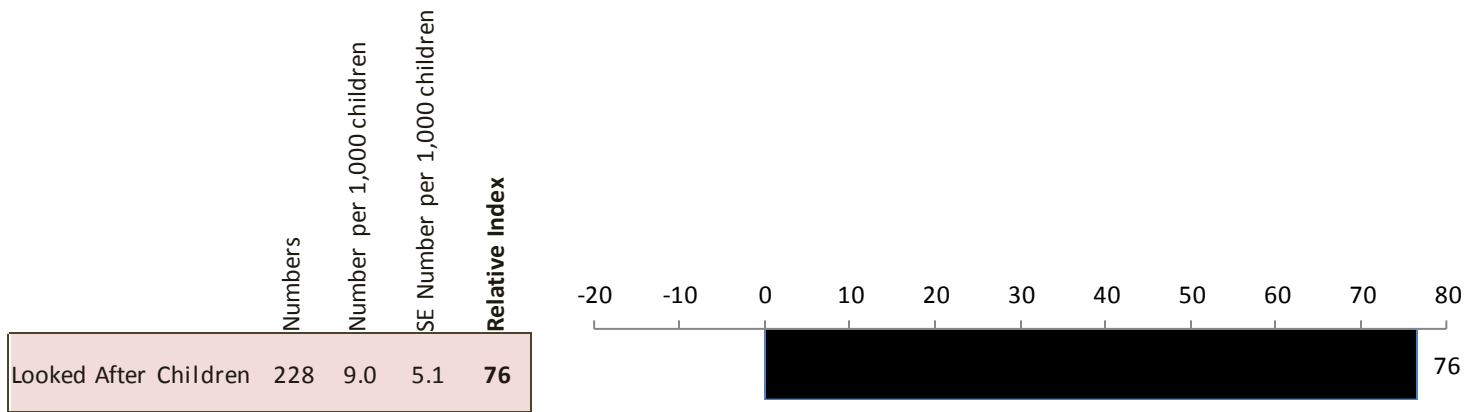

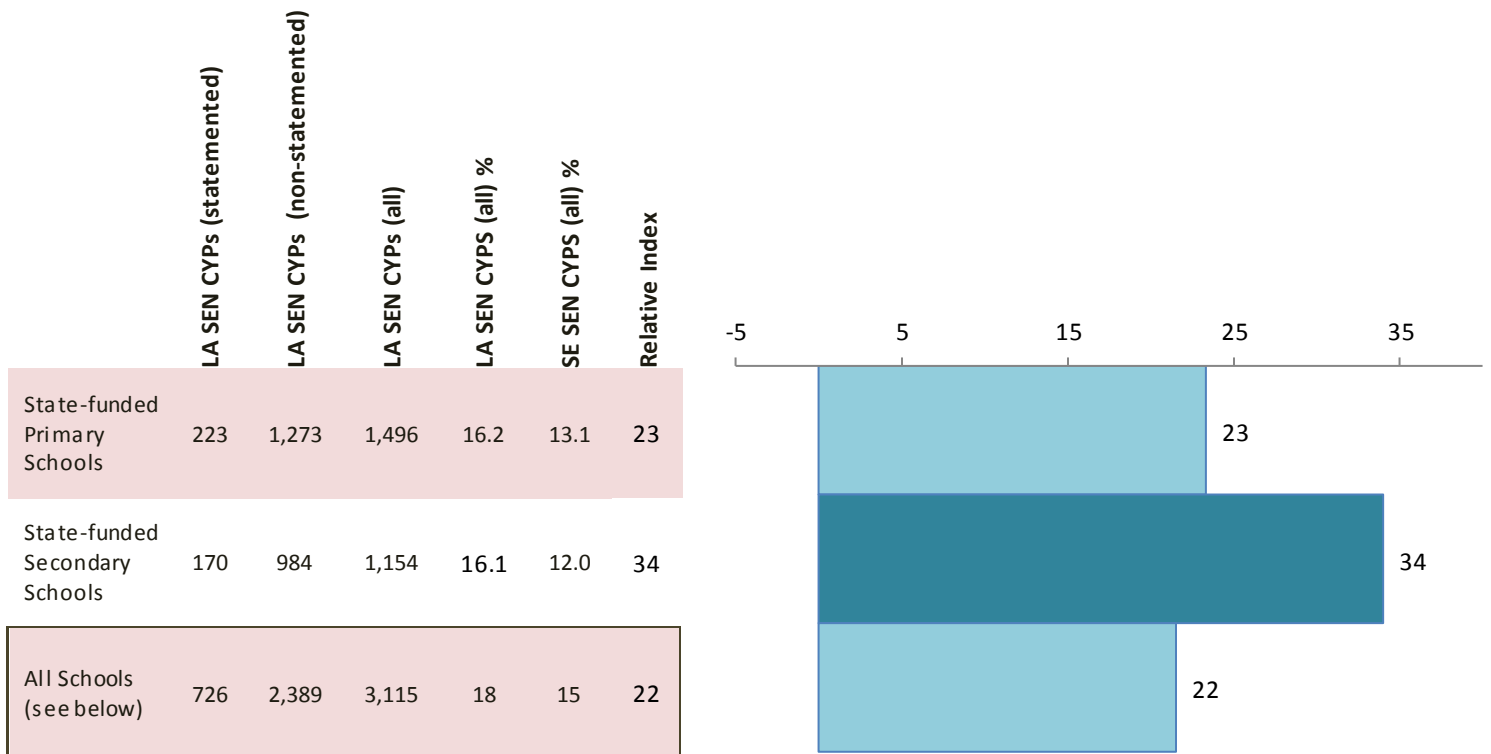

6. INDICATOR #4: CYP POPULATION – SEN CHILDREN (ALL TYPES < 19 years old)



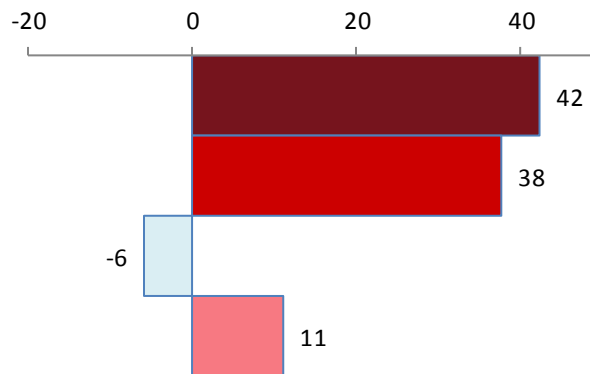

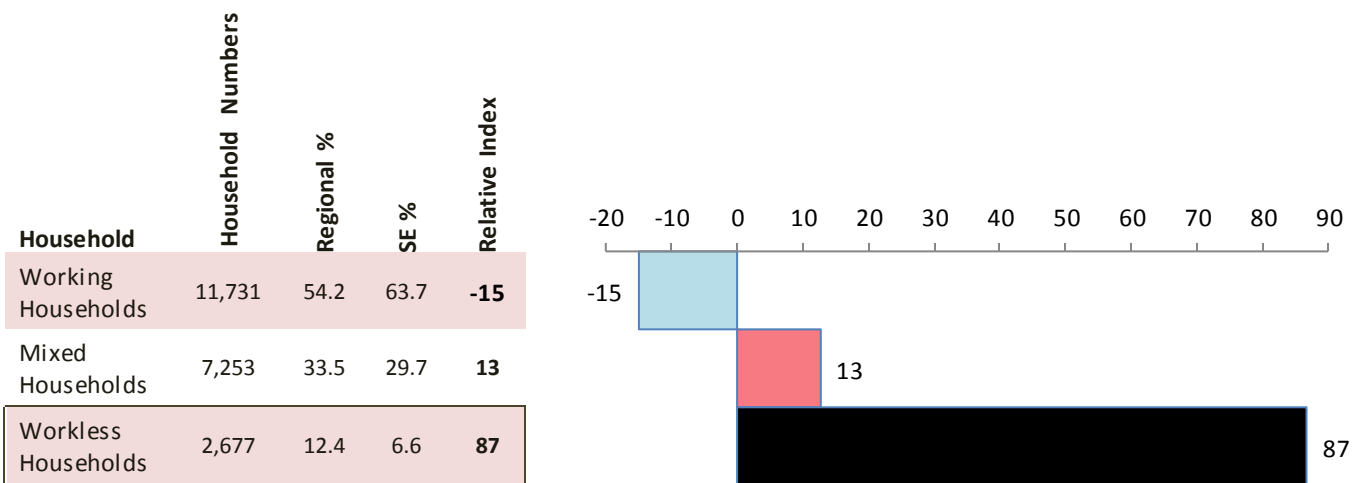

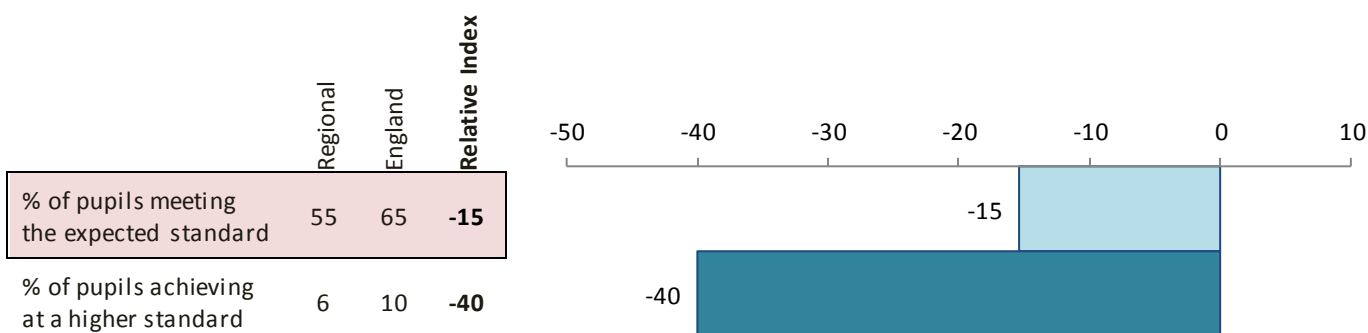

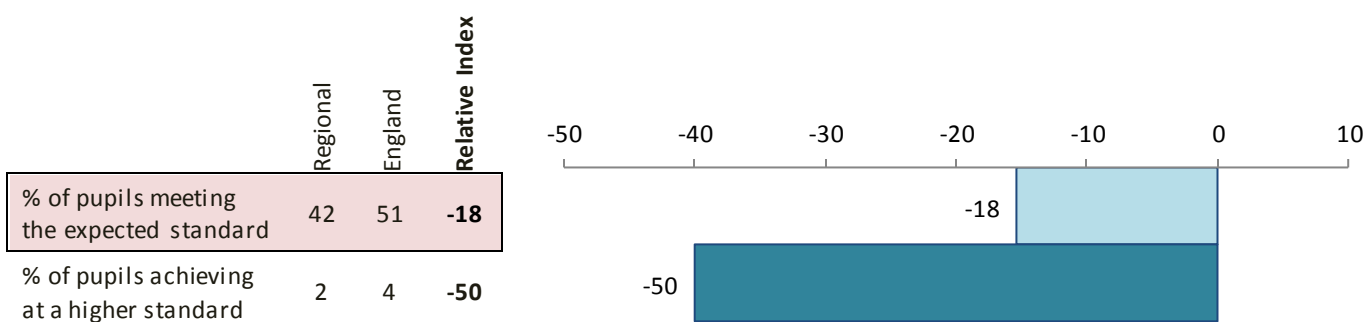

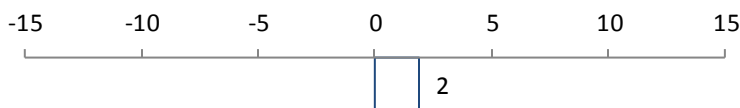

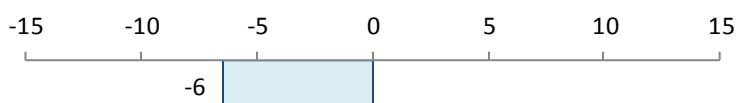

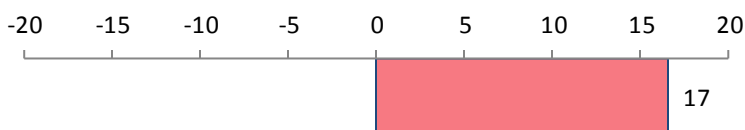

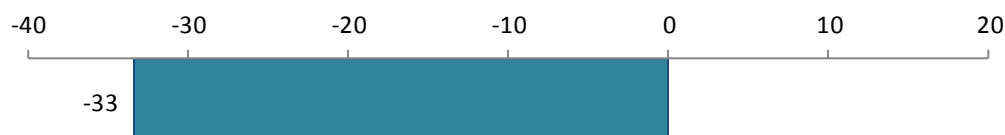
