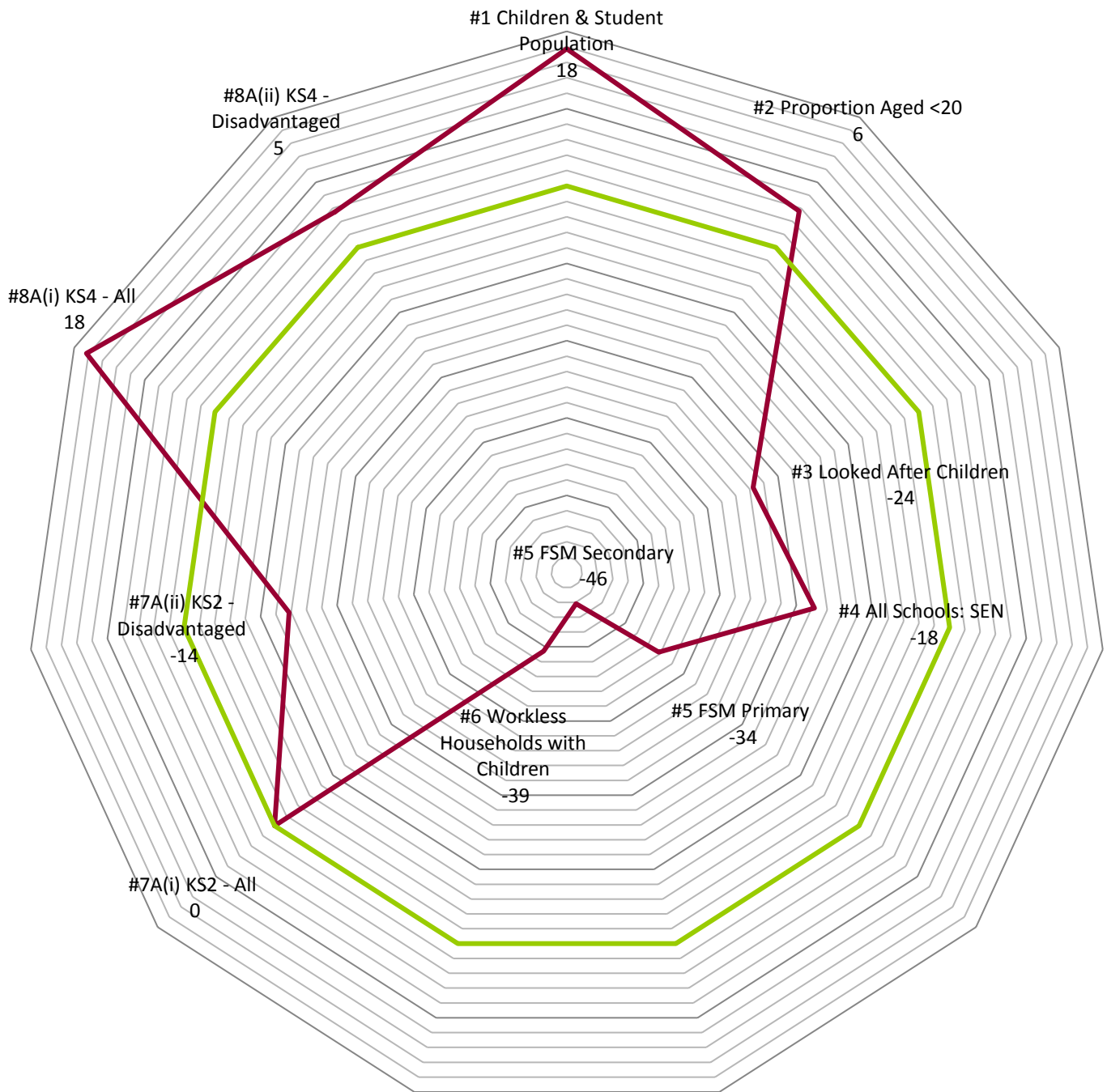


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1. BUCKINGHAMSHIRE CONTEXTUAL OVERVIEW (unweighted)

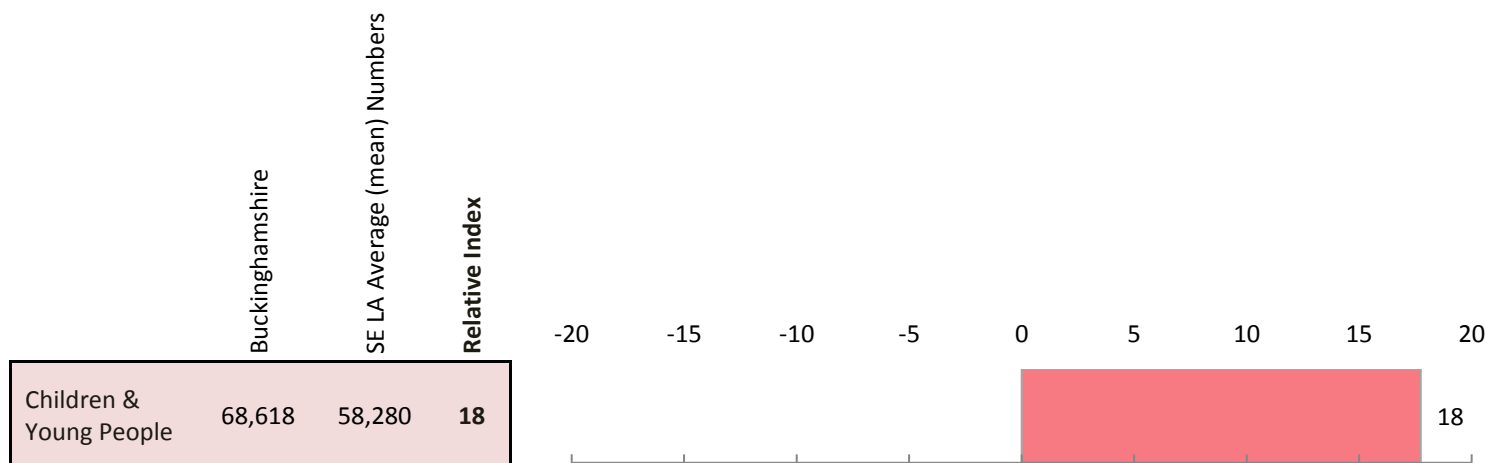

3. LOOKED AFTER CHILDREN (%)	-24	SIGNIFICANT – The proportion of looked after children in the region is significantly lower than the average SE figure
4. SEN CHILDREN (%)	-18	NOTEWORTHY – numbers of SEN children is notably lower in the region when compared to the SE as a whole
5a. FSM: Primary (%)	-34	SIGNIFICANT – the percentage of Primary CYPs eligible for Free School Meals is significantly lower in the Region compared to the SE

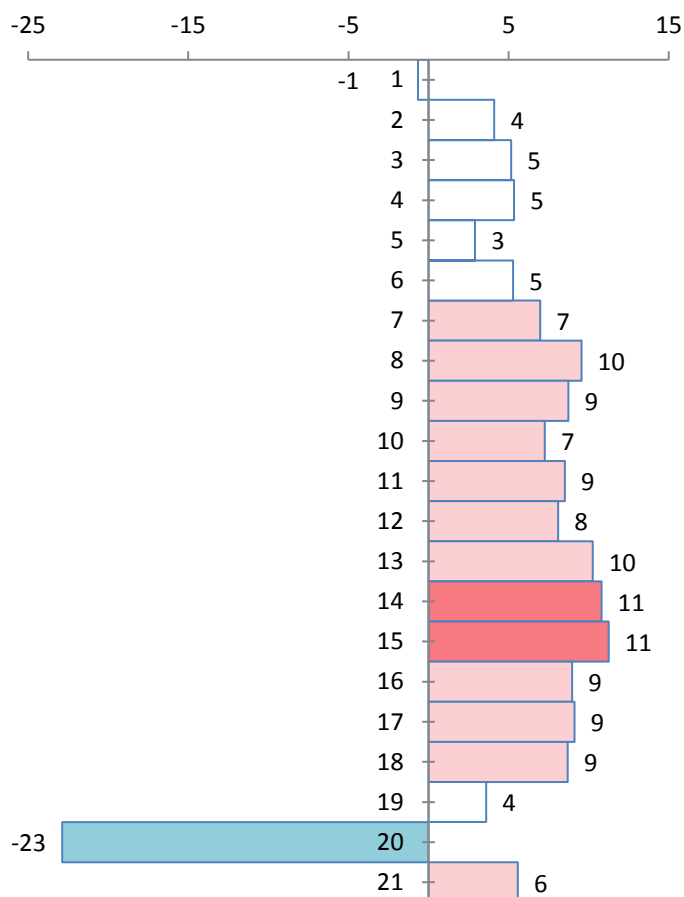

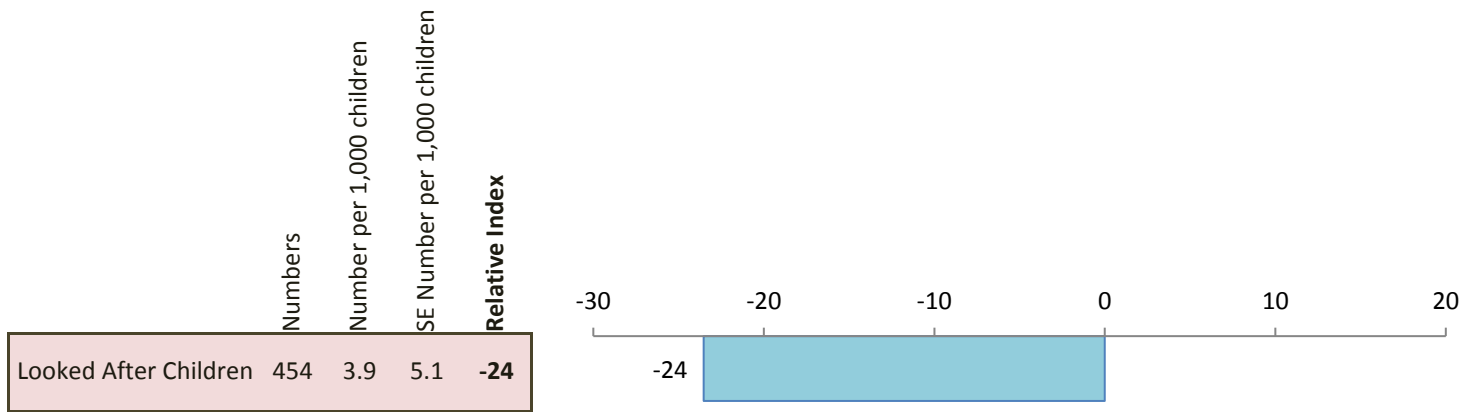

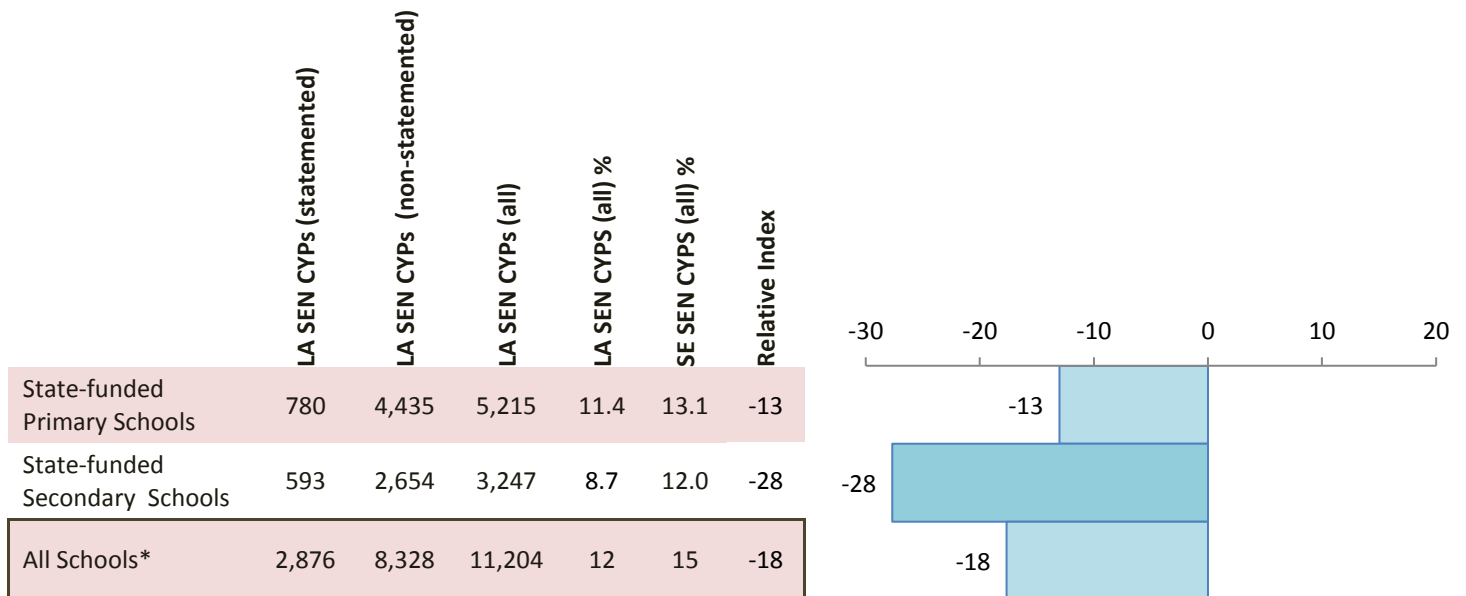

6. INDICATOR #4: CYP POPULATION – SEN CHILDREN (ALL TYPES < 19 years old)

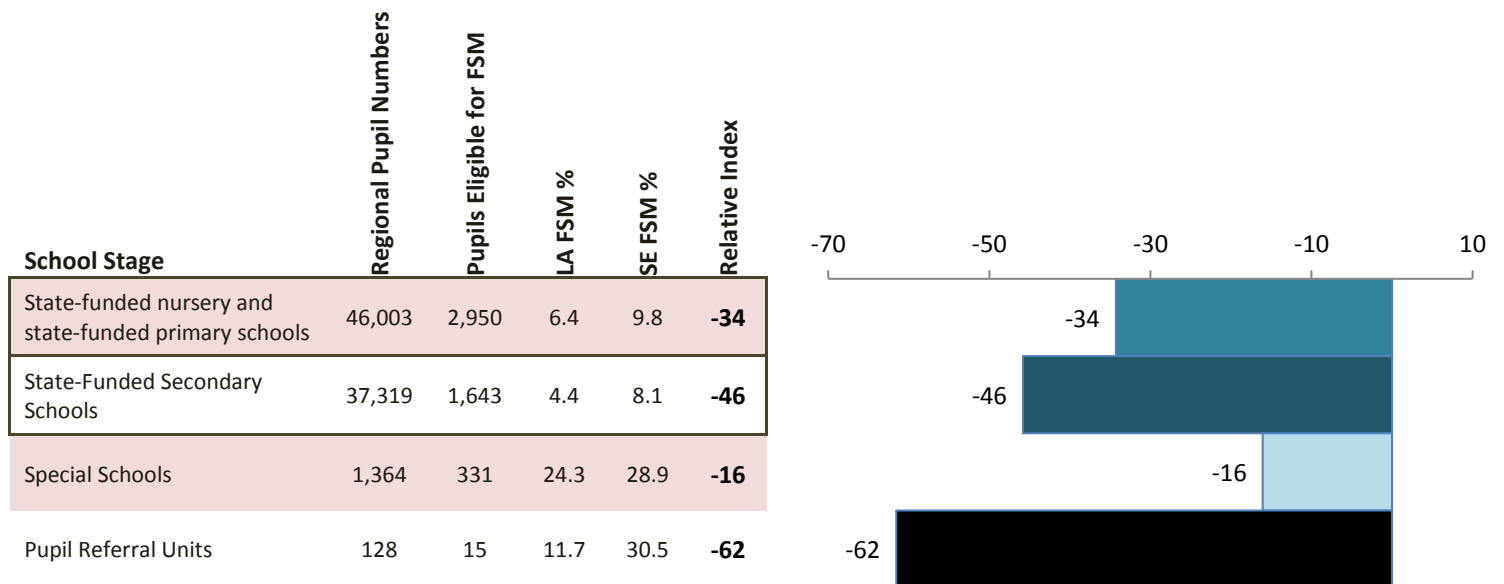

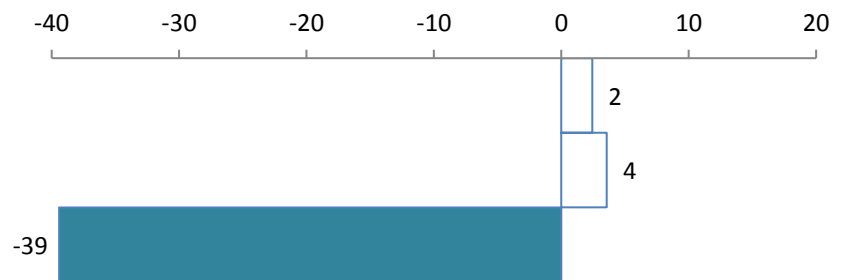

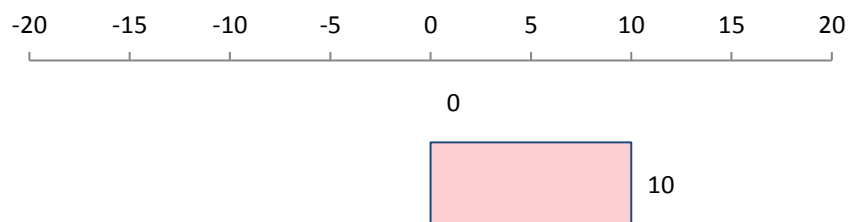

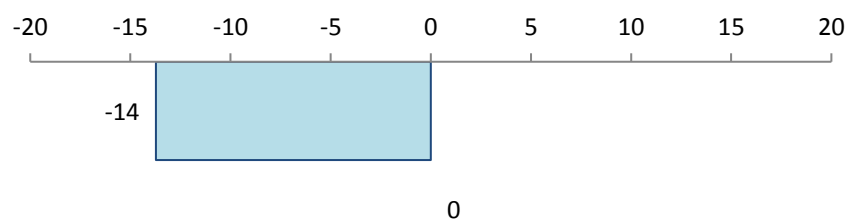

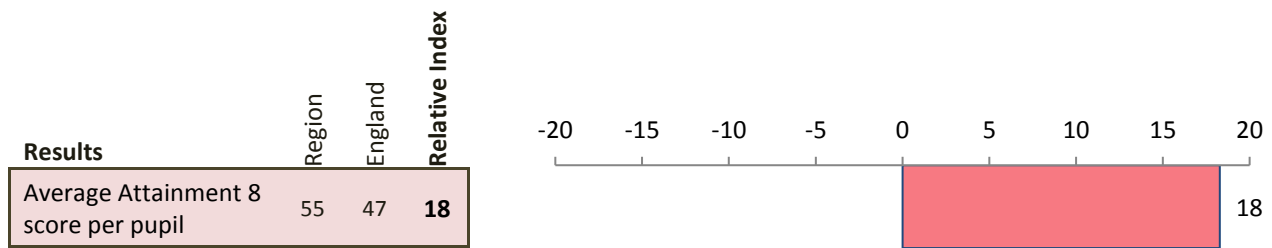

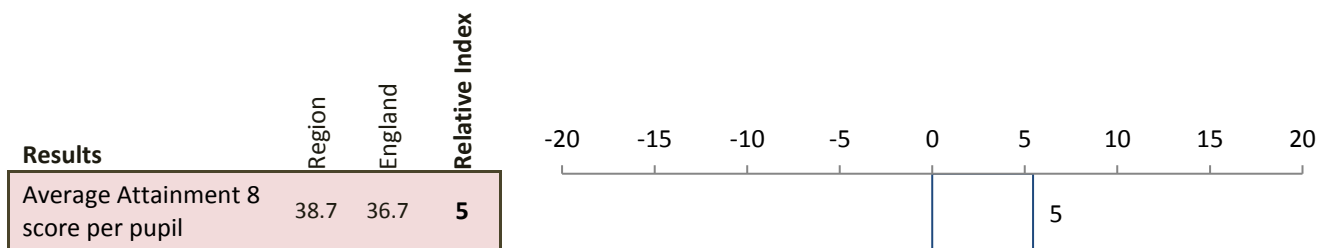
