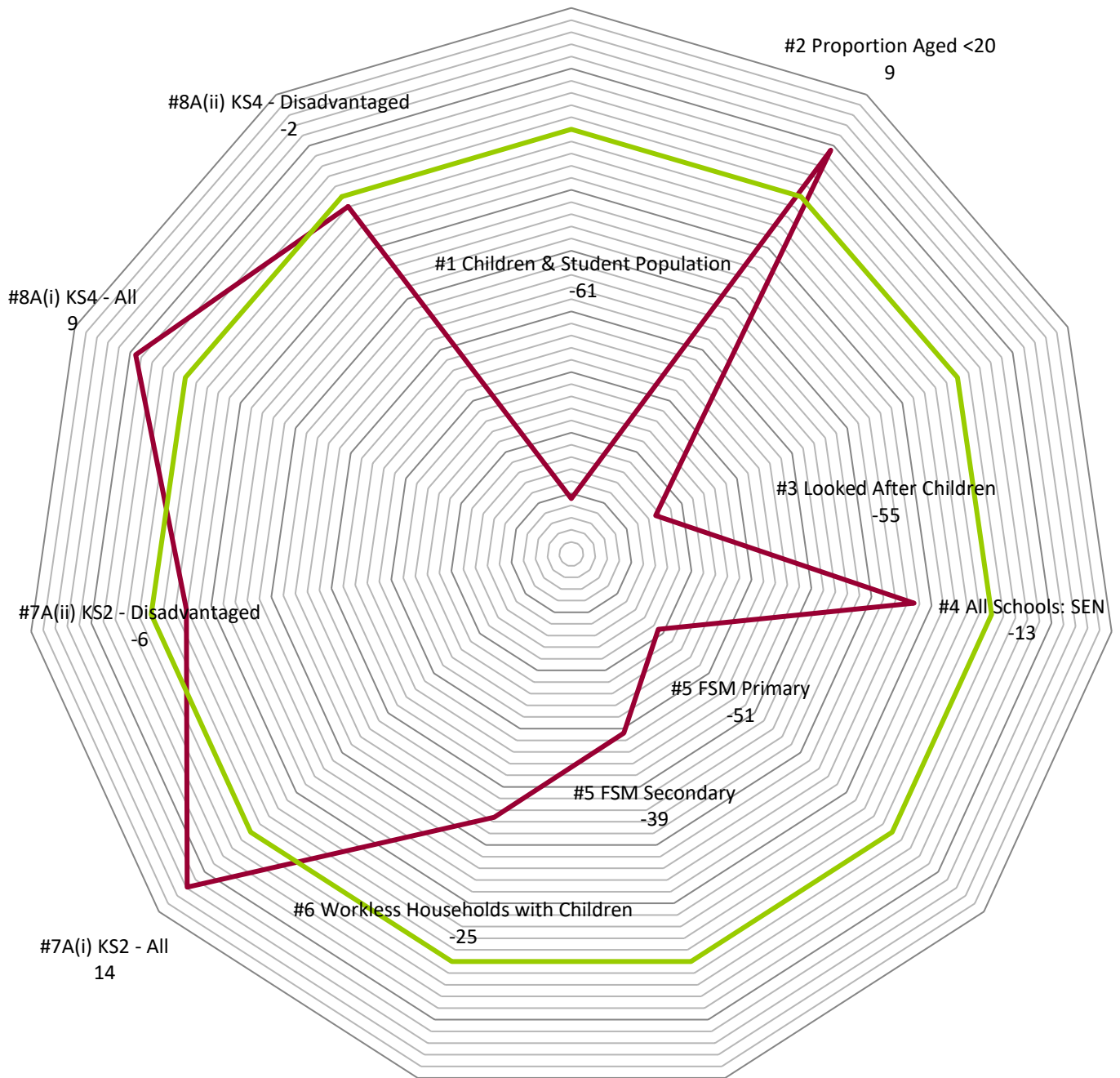


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1. WOKINGHAM CONTEXTUAL OVERVIEW (unweighted)

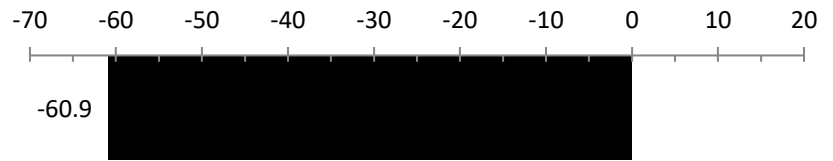
KEY DIMENSION	RAW INDEX	COMMENTS
1. PUPIL & STUDENT NUMBERS	-61	EXTREME – Numbers of CYP population living in Wokingham is extremely small when compared to the SE average figure of 114,861 per Tier 1 LA
2. POPULATION UNDER 20 (%)	9	TYPICAL – The proportion of Young People is slightly higher in Wokingham population, compared to the SE as a whole
3. LOOKED AFTER CHILDREN (%)	-55	SIGNIFICANT – The proportion of looked after children in the region is significantly lower than the average SE figure
4. SEN CHILDREN (%)	-13	NOTEWORTHY – The numbers of SEN children are notably lower in the region when compared to the SE as a whole
5a. FSM: Primary (%)	-51	EXTREME – The percentage of Primary CYP eligible for Free School Meals is extremely low in Wokingham compared to the SE
5b. FSM: Secondary (%)	-39	EXTREME – The percentage of Secondary CYP eligible for Free School Meals is extremely low in Wokingham compared to the SE
6. CYPs in WORKLESS HOUSEHOLDS (%)	-25	SIGNIFICANT – CYP are significantly less likely to live in a workless household compared to the SE average
7A(i). KS2 RESULTS - ALL	14	NOTEWORTHY – Attainment at KS2 is notably higher than the rest of England
7A(ii). KS2 RESULTS - DISADVANTAGED	-6	TYPICAL – The attainment gap when considering Disadvantaged children is lower than the rest of England
8A(i). KS4 RESULTS	9	TYPICAL – Attainment at KS4 is typical when compared to the rest of England
8A(ii). KS4 RESULTS - DISADVANTAGED	-2	TYPICAL – The attainment gap narrows for disadvantaged CYP when reaching KS4 level

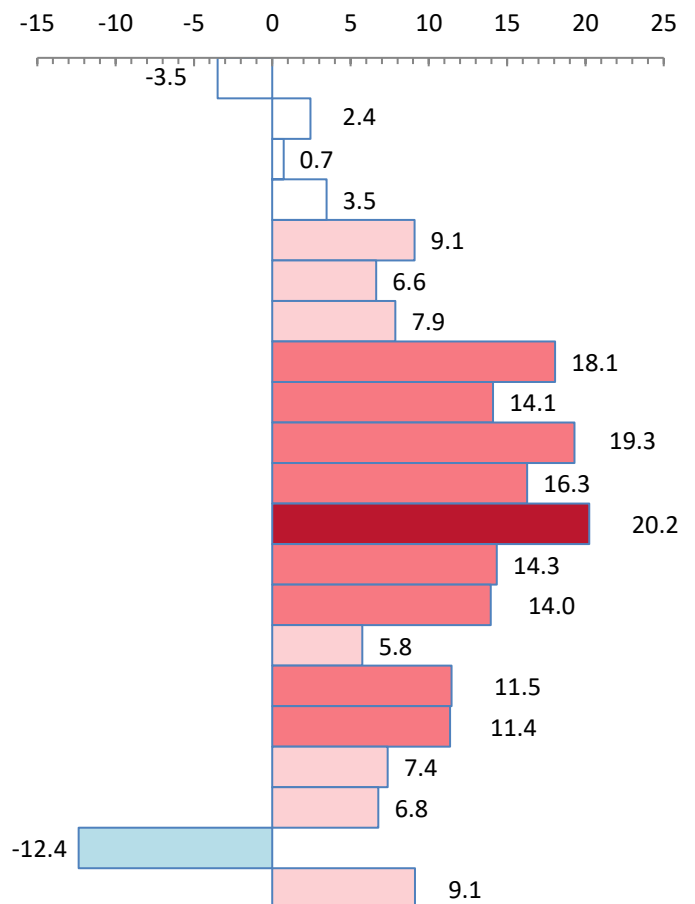

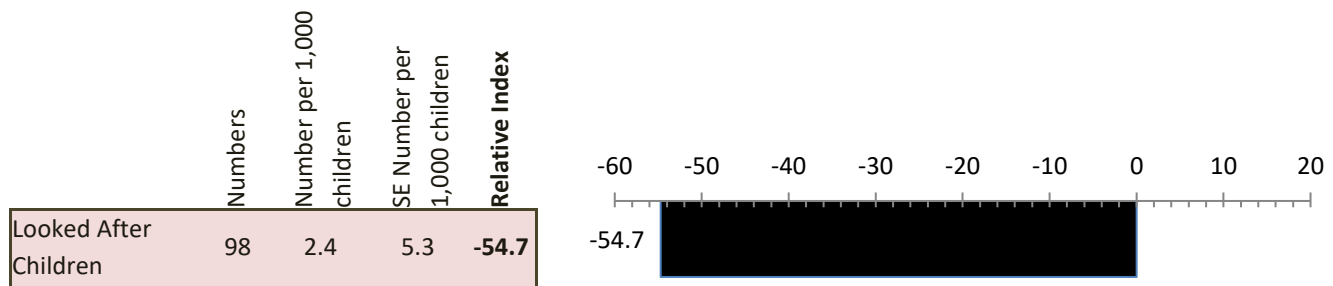

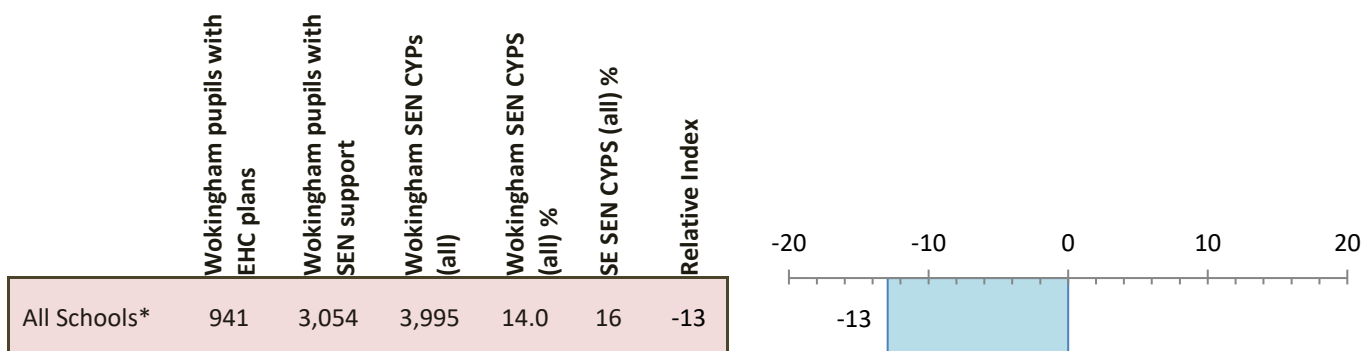

6. INDICATOR #4: CYP POPULATION – SEN CHILDREN (ALL TYPES < 19 years old)

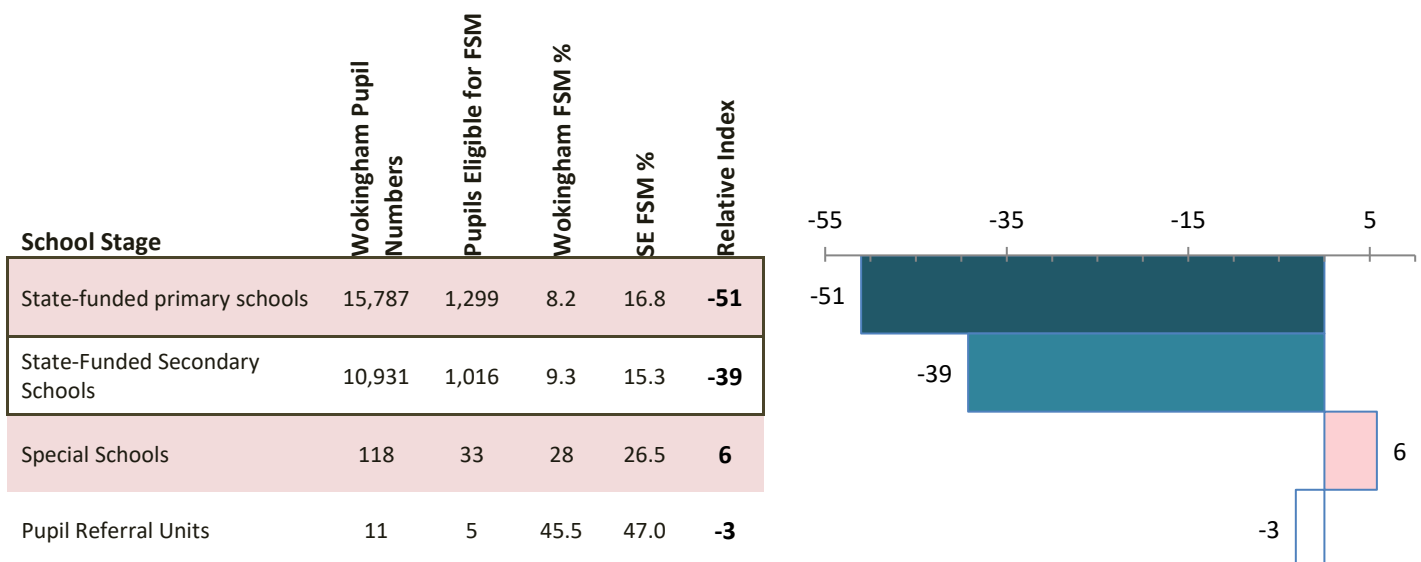

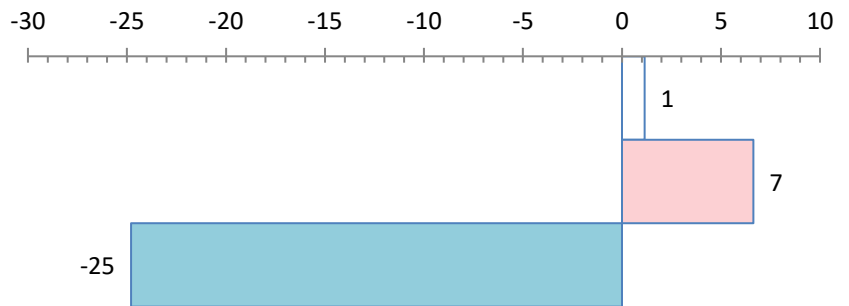

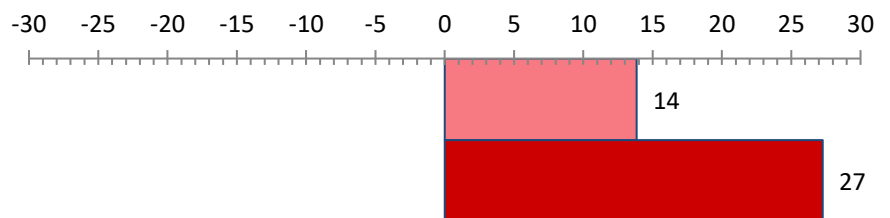

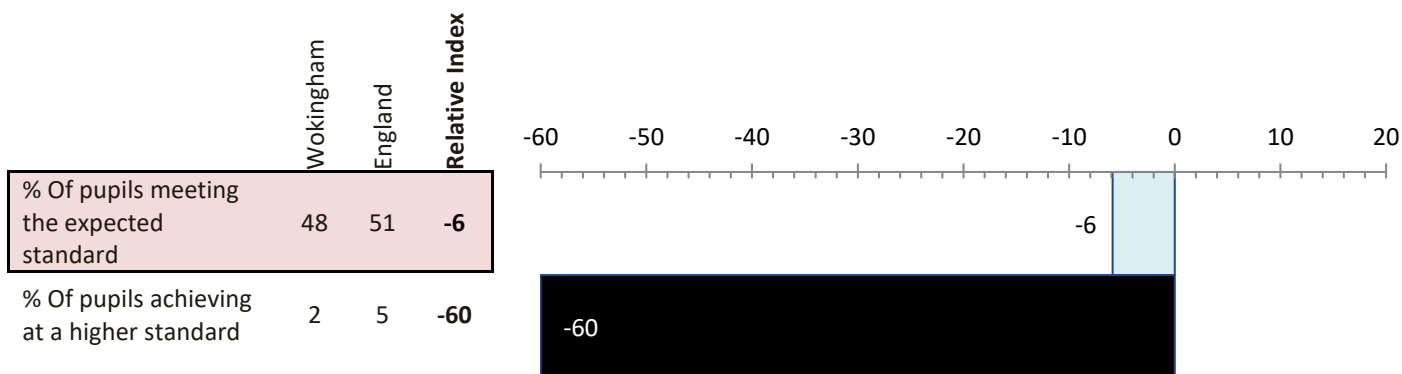

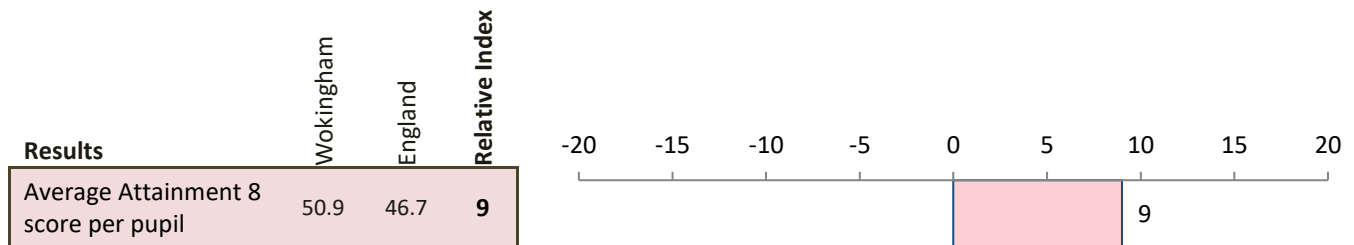

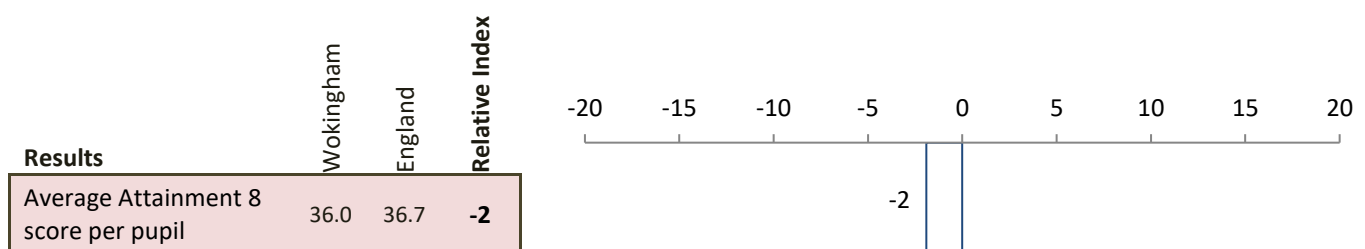
